THINK INTERNET SAFETY

Take care of your identity and good name online

Harassment online is bullying – don't do it and don't put up with it

mmediately seek help if you see nasty messages or uncomfortable content

Never share private photos, videos or details – once you post or upload you lose all control

Know who you are sharing your information with or don't share. Don't talk to strangers online.

WHAT'S IMPORTANT

Identity and Good Name. Keep control of your own details. Do not give your full name, address, age, school, village, town or county. Use strong and hard to crack passwords. Do not share passwords.

No Cyberbullying. Don't do it, don't bully back and don't put up with it – do keep a copy and do report it.

Help is there. You don't have to put up with nasty messages or uncomfortable content. Just reach out and help is there from classmates, parents, teachers and organisations like Childline.

Mind those photos. You lose control of all photos and videos once they are shared or sometimes even stored. Remember you might be embarrassed when you are older.
